21st Annual Smoky Hill Education Foundation Charity Golf Tournament Tuesday, May 30, 2017 Salina Municipal Golf Tournament



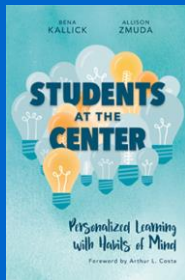

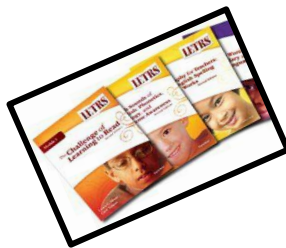

Guess Who: The mystery face game where you flip over a collection of faces with different color hair, eye color, hair, hats, glasses etc. to deduce who the secret person is that your opponent has chosen. You flip over the hooked tiles as you narrow your choices by asking characteristic questions. Ages 5-15.

Blurt: Think fast! What word means "a partially dried grape?" Be the first to say "raisin," and you're on your way to winning this riotous game of rapid word recall. Players take turns reading clues aloud, competing to blurt out the correct answer first and move ahead on the board. The first person or team to circle the board wins.
