Social-emotional Learning in the Daily Life of Classrooms 8:30 am – 11:30 am @ SHESC Salina

In this session, we will develop a deeper understanding about what social and emotional learning (SEL) is, including the core competencies as defined in the Kansas SECD standards and research base behind SEL. In addition, we will explore how teaching practices that support student development of social and emotional skills support academic learning and engagement in the classroom. Finally, we will review tools and resources that will also help teachers reflect on how their own social and emotional competencies influence their ability to implement teaching practices that promote student SEL skills.

Moving Your System Forward: Evaluating Efforts to Support the Social and Emotional Needs of Students and Teachers 12:30 pm – 3:30 pm @ SHESC Salina

In this session, we will discuss ways in which to embed SEL within a cycle of continuous improvement, including ways participants can use their current data systems and processes to support the social and emotional development of students and educators. We will think about both formal and informal ways to better understand our current SEL efforts. We will also review evidence from a recent evaluation of district-wide efforts to implement SEL.



PRESENTER: Nick Yoder, Senior TA Consultant

Nick Yoder is a senior technical assistance consultant. In his current role, Dr. Yoder leads the local area on safe and supportive classrooms, and social and emotional learning (SEL) for the <u>Center on Great Teachers and Leaders</u>, in which he provides technical assistance to states and districts on the integration of SEL and school climate with other educational reform initiatives, including college and career-readiness and teacher evaluation systems. In addition, Dr. Yoder provides training and coaching support to principals and teachers on effective instructional practices, including those practices that promote a safe and supportive learning, and promote the development of student social, emotional, and academic skills.

Along with providing technical assistant to states, districts, and schools, Dr. Yoder helps conduct program evaluations for SEL programs. Currently, Dr. Yoder is working on an Investing in Innovation development grant that is studying the impact of a school wide SEL intervention called School kit on the implementation of a classroom-based SEL program in Chicago Public Schools. He is also involved in Institutes for Education Science development grant that is analyzing the effects of an eighth-grade identity-based motivation program with Chicago Public School teachers and students.

Prior to joining AIR, Dr. Yoder was a research assistant at the University of Michigan, in which he researched the relationship between teacher instructional practices and student social and emotional development. In that role, he also taught educational psychology to preservice teachers at the University of Michigan's School of Education, and provided instructional coaching for novice teachers through an alternative certification program. Additionally, Dr. Yoder taught elementary school in Chicago Public Schools, in which he was lead teacher and provided professional development trainings to school staff.
