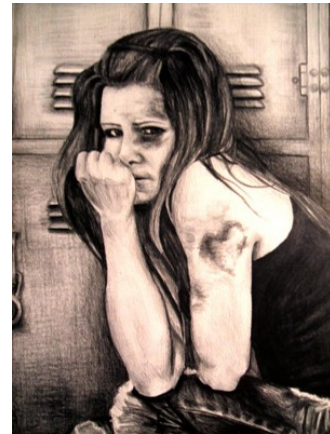


Teen Dating Violence

Regional Workshops

One in three teens experience some form of abuse from a dating partner. Yet, 80% of parents don't believe it is an issue and only 33% of teens in an abusive relationship seek help. We have to do a better job of educating our youth, parents, staff, and community and stop teen dating violence.



Workshop Objectives

- Learn a common definition of teen dating violence.
- Identify students most at risk of being victims or perpetrators of teen dating violence.
- Understand how protective factors can provide students with school connectedness.
- Understand how teen dating violence relates to school climate and culture.
- Learn strategies to prevent teen dating violence.
- Learn how to gain support from all involved – administration, staff, parents, students, and community.
- Leave with resources for classroom activities, school policies, and building-wide strategies.
