

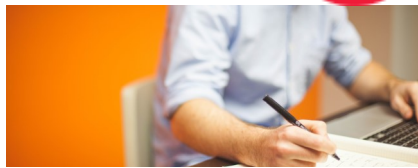

## 'Art of Digital Teaching' Helps with Technology Integration

Teachers are increasingly required to master integrating technology in the classroom, yet many have little to no training on how to do so effectively.
