Time to Code! Get a beginner's guide to computer programming

For those feeling intimidated by talk of "algorithms" and "networks" in the new Kansas Computer Science Standards, the fix is in with this brand-new workshop.

Pam Kraus, Career and Technical Education and STEM Consultant, designed "Coding Made Simple" as a fun and friendly introduction to the principles of coding and computing.

"This is for people who feel intimidated and don't know where to start," Kraus said.

The state computer science standards adopted in April 2019 cover all public school levels from preschool through high school seniors.

Kraus said many teachers she knows never expected to be teaching coding skills to students still learning basic math and reading.

The good news is that computer coding and programming is probably easier than teachers expect.



New Lumber, Cafeteria Supplies <u>Catalogs Go Live January 1</u>

The bids are in, and new prices for the volume purchasing lumber catalog and cafeteria supplies catalog are available as of January 1.

Prices mostly remain the same, with only a few items seeing a modest increase. There are also significant decreases on the way, including:

- All sizes disposable latex gloves: 14% less!
- Walnut plywood, 1/4" x 4' x 8': **14%** less/sheet!
- 50-pack dry sanding sheets, 9" x 11": 24% less!
- Alder select lumber: **28%** less/board foot!
- Foil potato wraps, six 500-count boxes: **51%** less!
