Voting Especially Important for Educators

School funding levels, retirement accounts, student loans, and educational priorities are all influenced by your vote. Educators in particular have a personal stake in who represents them, from the White House to local school boards, especially when school health, safety, and security are critical issues under debate. In 2020, it is also critical to plan ahead, especially for those voting by mail. Use the checklist guide below to make sure your voice is heard on important issues!

2020 Voting Checklist

□ **Registered?** Check at <u>myvoteinfo.voteks.org</u> to confirm correct address, party association, and polling location. If you are not listed, visit <u>go.smokyhill.org/voter-registration</u>, complete the form, and *mail* it (postmarked) by **October 13** to your county election officer, or register online at <u>www.kdor.ks.gov/Apps/VoterReg</u> by **October 13**.

□ **Voting by mail?** Apply for an advance ballot with the form at <u>go.smokyhill.org/advance-ballot</u>. Send the application to your county to be *received* by **October 27**. Remember to sign it and include your Kansas driver's license or ID number, or a copy of another valid ID. Then, complete the ballot that will come to you in the mail and return it to the county to be *received* by **12 p.m. on November 2**.

□ **Voting in person?** Check your polling location and hours in advance and ensure you have a current, valid ID. Allow extra time to vote on **November 3** and be prepared for poor weather, as social distancing requirements and long lines may mean waiting outside. Wear a face mask over your mouth and nose and practice good hand hygiene.

Professional Development Supports Health Science Pathway

According to the most recent employment projections from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, "Healthcare occupations and those associated with healthcare (including mental health) account for 13 of the 30 fastest growing occupations from 2019 to 2029."

In addition, all Kansas Workforce regions show a high demand in the healthcare field. With these facts in mind, the Smoky Hill ESC Perkins Consortium has set a goal to increase the number of districts in the consortium offering the Health Science Pathway from 15, currently, to all 44 SHESC consortium districts during the 2020-2024 grant period. To support this goal, the service center will be offering several opportunities to assist all districts in successfully implementing a new Health Science Pathway or improving their existing Pathway.

 October 20: Adding the Health Science Pathway (virtual workshop)

- November 10: Using Vernier Sensors to Improve Learning in Anatomy and Physiology
- January 15: End-of-Pathway Assessments, Credentials and Certifications (virtual workshop)
- Spring 2021 (Date TBD): Hands-On Anatomy
- Spring 2021 (Date TBD): Developing a Work-Based Learning Model

Fifteen consortium districts will also receive a total of \$40,922 from the Perkins grant for supplies to be used for required courses in the Health Science Pathway. All 44 consortium districts will have access to virtual reality equipment with software to provide VR learning opportunities in Health Science courses.
